In this beauti



In this beautifully curated postlude to the Debussy centenary year, pianist Andrew Matthews-Owen

is joined by singers Claire Booth and Susan Bickley in a programme that looks both outward to Debussy's contemporaries and inward to his personal life. The composer's Cinq poèmes de Baudelaire, written while still under the Wagnerian spell, forms the centrepiece, with Booth's rich lower register beguilling in 'Le jet d'eau', even if a shade more power

would be welcome elsewhere.
Jonathan Dove's Letters from
Claude draws on Debussy's letters
to his wives, Lilly Texier and Emma
Bardac, the texts capturing the
essence of these passionate and
tangled relationships. Written for
these performers, the seven songs
each take as their starting point a
fragment from Debussy's music. It is
enchanting, yet ultimately painfully
sad, the final song juxtaposing the
composer's despondency in the
midst of war and illness with his cold
rejection of Lilv after their split.

The mood is gently lifted by songs from Bardac's former lover, Fauré, shared between the two singers, and Bickley sings the quixotic Satie melodies that frame the recital. There is a periodic husk to both singers' voices that cannot always be attributed to honesty of expression, yet there is so much to enjoy here. Matthews-Owen judges the pace exquisitely throughout, while the segue from Satie's Vexations to the closing 'Je te veux' is a masterstroke. Christopher Dingle
