"In the silence a space is opened which can only be opened with the disappearance of sound." (Jürg Frey, 1998)

Matt Geer is interested in Franciscan spirituality which encapsulates the transcendence of creation. It is only in periods of contemplation that we can meditate upon the mystical phenomenality of the natural world.

*sound-silence* allows the listener to experience two things;

- a) the consequences of silence on sound, and
- b) the natural fluctuation of one's temporal consciousness when encountering a flat and unchanging aesthetic.
